Scotland is the only home nation lacking non-vocational moving image qualifications. The current review of SQA National Qualifications rules out any developments in the near future. Scottish Screen and the Association for Media Education in Scotland (AMES) wish to investigate whether Scottish schools and colleges would be willing to offer the Northern Ireland CCEA (Council for the Curriculum Examinations and Assessment) in Moving Image Arts AS level (1 year) and A2 level (2 years).
